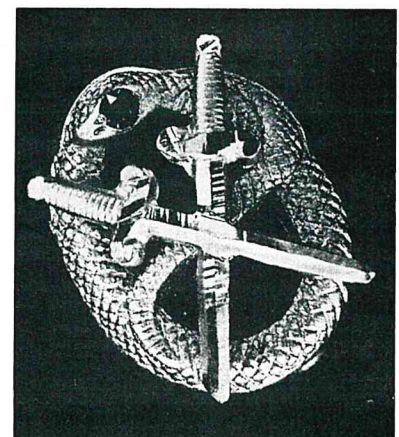

Unfortunately, or fortunately, in September 1951 I was drafted. After 22 months in the San Francisco area, I returned (with the GI Bill) and continued graduate studies. I lived at the house during the '53-'54 and '54-'55 school years as I pursued my studies, first toward an MS in food technology and later for a PhD in chemical engineering. I have many fond memories of the brothers **Carp**, **John** ['51-542] and **George** ['54-585], **Harra** [**George**, '54-581], **Enger** [**John**, '52-552], and others too numerous to mention. Some of the brothers may remember me for having a car with a bed in the back. I had slept in the car for most of my 22-month US Army Veterinary Corps enlistment time. The car also proved useful during the time I used it in and around Corvallis." John now lives at 5 Country Spring Dr., Asheville, NC 28804.
